MRPA Membership Application

Membership Categories:

- A. Contractor Membership: The active membership shall be made up of individuals, partnerships, firms and corporations whose primary functions are one or more of the following: bituminous crack treatment, concrete crack sealing, joint resealing with minor small repair, overband crack filling, single chip seal, double chip seal, micro-surfacing with crack preparation, shoulder slurry seal, shoulder chip seal, shoulder fog seal, full depth concrete pavement repair, diamond grinding and dowel bar retrofit. Furthermore, they shall have demonstrated unquestionable technical skill and integrity, and have expressed a sincere desire to engage in the application of Preventive Maintenance products and processes. Active members shall be full voting members.
- B. Associate Membership: The associate membership shall be a special class of individuals or firms which are not covered under active membership, however, are vitally interested in the firms which are not covered under active membership, however, are vitally interested in the Preventive Maintenance industry. Examples of this class are material suppliers, Sub-Contractors, equipment suppliers consulting engineers and, testing and design services. Associate members shall not be eligible to vote or hold office.
- C. Honorary Membership: The honorary membership shall be made up of individuals who have performed distinguished service for the Association or the industry. Honorary members shall not be eligible to vote or hold office unless otherwise qualified to do so by being a paid Contractor or member. Honorary members are approved annually by vote of Board of Directors.
- D. Government Membership: The government membership shall be an individual or public entity with a vital interest in quality Preventive Maintenance products being contracted and placed in it's (his/her) jurisdiction. Government members are not eligible to vote or hold office.

ARTICLE 24.

Subsidiaries, affiliates, branches or divisions of a member company, which constitute a separate legal entity, shall not be considered members except if they apply separately for membership. Applications for active, associate, or government membership shall be presented to the Board of Directors in writing on the forms provided and shall duly executed by the individual, firm or corporation making such application. The Board shall approve or reject such applications by majority vote. All new members shall pay the full amount of the annual dues when they apply for membership. The new member's dues for the second year of membership will be prorated. All members shall be reviewed by Board of Directors annually.

ARTICLE 26.

Any member may terminate membership by giving thirty (30) days written notice to the Secretary and upon payment of all dues and assessments to date of withdrawal.

ARTICLE 27.

All active and associate members shall pay annual dues, which shall be set by the Board of Directors. All such dues shall be payable on a schedule established by the Board and incorporated in the policy manual.

ARTICLE 28.

The Board of Directors shall have the authority to terminate the membership of any member who fails to pay dues or other obligations to the Association for a period of thirty days after the same became due. In addition, the Board of Directors shall have the authority to terminate, by a 3/4 vote, the membership of any member who has demonstrated a lack of integrity or technical skill with respect to Preventive Maintenance products and application. Notice of any such termination shall be sent by registered or certified mail.
